Meeting Attendees: Chair Gene Janikula, Dan Domjahn, Barry Pawelk, and Julie Marquardt. Paula LaVigne wasn't present.

The regular monthly meeting was called to order by the chair at 5:30 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Approval of Agenda

Approval of Minutes

Treasurer's Report

LaVigne reported that \$5,809.53 was received during the month of February. The approximate ending fund balance as of February 28, 2025, was \$372,815.65. MMS to approve the Treasurer's Report by Domjahn and Pawelk. MCU.

Claims

Claims in the amount of \$34,750.02 was presented to the Board. MMS to approve the claims (copy of claims attached), recommended to replace the GFI after it being tripped through the month of January and February by Domjahn and Pawelk. MCU

Old Business

Culvert Policy: Amend current policy to remove non-burnable. Woodland Township culvert minimum are to be 40 feet long by 15 inches in diameter. MMS by Domjahn and Pawelk to amend the culvert policy to remove non-burnable. MCU.

2026 Mack Truck Warranty: Discussion of extending the warranty on the 2026 Mack Truck. The truck won't get near the milage that is included in the extended warranty. Usually, the trucks in the township get 400 hours a year. MMS by Domjahn and Pawelk to not purchase the extended warranty. MCU.

Annual Meeting Organization: In LaVigne's absence Janikula will go through the Treasurer's Report, along with the fire contract. Pawelk will discuss dust control and gravel. Domjahn will report on culvert policy, equipment, and employees.

Dust quotes were the same for both companies. We will go with Central Minnesota as we have in the past. Quality propane came in at the same price but have used Central Minnesota Dust Control for the past few years.

PUP Trailer: Locking pin on the red trailer. It is hot all the time, so it stays locked in. Hilgers will take this to Towmaster.

94 PUP won't pass DOT inspection. The same tires aren't available anymore. Pomp's tire Service recommended a different tire, that it are very similar. Hilgers will get pricing.

New decals on the truck. It was completed on Thursday.

110 Gallon from fluid all, the tank on the bottom has a small bulge. What would happen if another tote was placed on top. We could put both of them on a stand.

Blue Mack no longer has the plow on it.

Church is completed in July. The concrete parking lot will be done. They stockpiled aggregates before road restrictions. They can mix concrete on site.
